OLYMPIA, WA – The Washington State Arts Commission (ArtsWA) and the Washington Department of Veteran Affairs (WDVA) gathered on January 18 to celebrate a new partnership—together, the two agencies will distribute \$250,000 in grants for arts-based programming at the four State Veterans Homes and the Transitional Housing Program.

"The past three years has been especially challenging for Veterans and families in our State Veterans Homes and Transitional Housing Program. COVID related precautions severely limited our ability to offer in-person programming such as painting, live music from community groups, or attending local theater events," said David Puente, Director of the Washington Department of Veterans Affairs.

"Funding from the ArtsWA Grant will allow our Veterans and families to connect with the arts and we know this will have a positive impact on their quality of life. We are extremely grateful for this partnership with the Washington Arts Commission and look forward to sharing stories of its impact."

As of Jan. 17, Veterans in acute suicidal crisis will be able to go to any VA or non-VA health care facility for emergency health care at no cost – including inpatient or crisis residential care for up to 30 days and outpatient care for up to 90 days. Veterans do not need to be enrolled in the VA system to use this benefit.




Walla Walla Veterans Home Welcomes Newly Adopted Pup

A new tax credit for Washington workers. Get up to \$1200 back

From now through Dec. 31, 2023, individuals and families can apply for the Working Families Tax Credit. There are three ways to apply:

- Online using MyDOR, our secure filing system.
- Efile through federal tax preparation software or professional tax preparers.
- By mail using a paper application.


