




2. Chromebook Ports \*Note: USB-C can be used to charge devices and transfer files.



# 3. Getting Started & Signing In

#### Step 1: Power on the Chromebook





Step 1.1: Click on Let's go.

Step 2: Connect to your hotspot on your phone

**<u>Step 2.1</u>**: Follow the *Hotspot Guide* to set up and turn on your hotspot if you have not done so already.


Step 2.2: Find your hotspot on the list and click on it.

**<u>Step 2.3</u>**: Type your password and press <u>Connect</u> to finish connecting. (Click the eye on the right side of the box to see if your password is typed correctly.)

Step 3: Accept and continue Google's terms of service

<u>Step 3.1:</u> Un-check the optional reporting feature if you do not want to send information anonymously with Google

Step 3.2: Let Chromebook check for updates.



Step 4: Log into your Gmail Account



- 2) Type your first and last name.
- 3) Fill out the basic information.
- 4) Create a username for your email address.
  - a. If your username isn't allowed or is already being used by someone else, you will see a message like the ones in red below. Select another name until you don't see the red message and you are able to click the Next button.

- 5) Enter a password for your new Gmail account. The click Next.
  - a. Use this password checker to test how strong your password is: https://bitwarden.com/password-strength/
- 6) Skip entering a phone number.
  - a. You can add a phone number to your account for security purposes when your computer is set up.
- 7) Make sure your name and email are what you entered before hitting Next.
- 8) Scroll down to the bottom of Privacy and Terms and click l agree.
  - a. You can read Google's terms of service and their privacy rules anytime you want here: <u>https://policies.google.com/?hl=en-US</u>
- 9) Click Accept and continue.
  - a. Don't check "Receive sync options following setup".
- 10) Click More.
  - a. Make sure "Back up to Google Drive..." is checked so that you can access any documents on your computer on any other device that you sign into.
- 11) Click Accept
  - a. If you do not want to share location data with Google, uncheck the box that says "Use Location..."
- 12) Click No thanks for setting up Google Assistant.
  - a. You can set this feature up later if you would like access to it.
- 13) Click Get started!
  - a. Uncheck "Sign me up" if you don't want Chromebook tips from Google.

### 6. Maintenance & Cleaning

Step 1: TURN OFF THE CHROMEBOOK!!! Wait for the Chromebook to cool down.

Step 2: Unplug any accessories.



<u>Step 3:</u> With the Chromebook opened, turn it upside down and gently shake it to clean the keyboard. Then wipe the keyboard with a DRY microfiber cleaning cloth. <u>NEVER</u> <u>SPRAY THE CHROMEBOOK!!!</u>



<u>Step 4:</u> Lightly dampen a microfiber cleaning cloth with water and GENTLY wipe the screen. Then DRY the screen with a microfiber cleaning cloth. <u>NEVER SPRAY THE</u> <u>CHROMEBOOK!!!</u>



# 7. Troubleshooting 101

When having any technical issues with your Chrome Book, go to Google's Chromebook Help Site: <u>support.google.com/chromebook</u>

#### **Troubleshooting Common Issues**



Most problems can be solved by Signing Out and Signing In again, or restarting the Chromebook. Deleting files in your downloads (located in your Google Drive) can sometimes speed up a slow computer.

Page not working? Try the refresh key



Having too many extensions will slow down your internet and cause pages to close. Disable extensions through the Google Chrome Browser toolbar under "More Tools", then click on "Extensions".



Similar to extensions, having too many open tabs can slow down internet browsing and general functionality.

Issue	Key Commands
Screen isn't powering on The Chromebook is sluggish The touchpad is not responding	Refresh the Chromebook by pressing <b>c</b> + లి

# 8. Additional Information

Congrats on the new Chromebook! But what is the difference between a Chromebook and a laptop?

- Laptops usually run-on the Microsoft Windows or Mac Operating System, while Chromebooks run on Google's Chrome Operating System.
- It runs most of its applications out of the cloud (more about that below), whereas laptops run its applications on itself.


Ok, but what is the "Cloud," and does it look like a bunny?

Sadly, these clouds do not look like bunnies.

Put simply, the cloud refers to computers that can store files and run programs for you from somewhere else. Think of it as outsourcing everything so your Chromebook does not have to do everything all on its own.

Interesting, but how do I know what to use when I need to work on a file?






