



Prevent Veteran Suicide Emblem Application

The general public may purchase a prevent veteran suicide emblem. Funds for this emblem go to support programs aimed to prevent veteran military member suicide.

You must provide a current plate number and vehicle identification number. When purchasing multiple emblems, provide this information for one vehicle.

When completed, take this form with a **check or money order for \$10 per emblem plus a \$8 one-time service fee** (payable to Department of Licensing) to any vehicle licensing office or mail to:

The 988 Suicide Prevention Emblem can be placed on your license plate allowing you to join the fight against suicide.

Because a major protective factor for suicide is community engagement and peer connection, 100% of proceeds received by WDVA go to fund community-based suicide prevention services. The Suicide Prevention Community-Based Grant Program was established to fund grassroots peer-services in communities addressing suicide among Service Members, Veterans, and military families.



This grant opportunity is open to nonprofit community organizations and providers across the state of Washington. It encourages the development and expansion of peer support programs that can effectively address the unique challenges faced by Veterans, service members, and their families. These programs will play a crucial role in fostering a sense of community, understanding, and connection among individuals who have served or are currently serving in the military.



In July of 2024, the first Community Based Grant was awarded to the Alatheia Therapeutic Riding Center, located in Chelan County, WA. This organization has been at the forefront of providing suicide prevention and PTSD services to Washington's Service Members, Veterans, and their Families.
